BEFORE SCHOOL ROUTINE

Thank you to those families who are assisting us to establish our morning routines.

A reminder to everyone that all students who arrive at school prior to 8:25am are required to go straight to the quadrangle in front of the undercover area.

Those students who come into the school very close to 8:25am and go outside their classroom with their parents are reminded that they must stay with their parents who will

supervise them as no teachers are on duty other than the quadrangle at this time. There will be no playing on equipment or running around playing games in the playground for the same reason.

All students who are not with their parents should be in the quadrangle. These students are released to their classrooms at 8:25am.

It is best that arrival is as close to 8:25am as possible when classrooms will be opened for students to enter and organise their belongings in preparation for the day.
